Lily Faerman, Chess Instructor

- Began playing chess as a child in Moscow
- represented the US in the Youth world championship under 14 years old in Paris

- As an adult, began teaching chess and has been doing it for 20 years. Has worked in public and private NYC schools, NJ schools as well.
- Structure of class: 15 minute interactive lesson, ask lots of questions to lead students. Kids offer moves, ideas, and are encouraged to ask questions. Then they play the practice games while I walk around, observe the games, comment on their moves. At the end of the class we give a summary and kids can share tricks, tactics, strategies that they discovered in their games. Students are also encouraged to teach someone at home in order to practice regularly. They can also practice with a computer. Kids love to share with the class what they've been doing.
- Question: How do you deal with kids being upset about not winning, and how do you refocus them on learning versus winning or losing?
- Answer: I always address that topic and explain that the most important thing is the journey, the learning. They should be ready for winning, losing, and drawing their games because it's part of the learning process. I always tell them that even Grandmasters lose, even World Champions lose and I tell them that even I lose. It's ok for kids to lose their games too sometimes. I talk to the whole class and explain that it's not a bad thing to lose, the fact that you're upset shows that you really care and love the game. It's important to address this because if a child is only focused on winning, then they don't enjoy the journey. Chess is a tool to teach kids to be better human beings, to be more confident.
- Q: Which grades do you teach? I currently teach 3rd, 4th, and 5th grade classes and in the Spring I will begin with Kindergarten, 1st, and 2nd grade.

Assemblymember Rosenthal

- Presented PS 199 with a \$25,000 check for After School Program. Funds will hopefully be received in January
- If we need other things from my office, I'm just at 72nd between Broadway and West End. I go to Albany in January. Ben Amster, my community liaison will be happy to help you with whatever you need.
- The Education Budget in the State, we included:
 - 10 million dollars to train 20,000 teachers and TAs in best practices for evidence-based literacy instructional practices
 - \$24.9 billion in foundation aid \$934 million increase over last year's budget. We've put in 35.9 billion in support of public schools across the state
 - In other counties, like upstate, they know exactly how much each school district gets. But because we're five counties in New York city, it's impossible to parse that out. Which is, you can't make change if you don't know what the facts are. Hopefully this district gets what it needs. You have a good superintendent who advocates very well for District 3, but let me know [what you need].

- OMNY cards—wrote to the MTA and the DOE. This is not fair, we shouldn't pick and choose who gets the OMNY card. I am meeting with the MTA and will see the new Chancellor at noon, so I will bring it up to her as well.
- 71st street which is very busy where the McDonalds is. Met with the DOT and took a tour of the block, it's such a wide street. There's so much opportunity to make it a beautiful place, instead it's too busy. I asked them to redesign the block, everything is slow in city government, but I will continue to push that. There is a concern over the kids in McDonalds, when there is a gun fight, it doesn't really involve those kids, for the most part. its people coming from outside the area, they have a grudge against their "friend" and they have a gun. The police mostly come after there is an incident. I've talked to the 20 precinct commander, she says they're going to check in regularly. High school kids hang out at McDonalds, we need to offer kids in some of the high schools after school programming that's fun and educational; a place to hang out that's not the street. Of course McDonald's will always be a draw, we can't just say get out of here, but they can beautify their area.

Teachers' Update from 1st grade teacher and UFT Co-chapter leader, Bethany Trench

- SLT update—new subcommittees:
 - Equity and Diversity
 - Parents as Partners
 - Sustainability
 - Class Size Advocacy
- This new law changes our class size limits. Principal Xerri is amazing at working with our budget to keep our classes small. We can only do so much with the funding that we're given.
- Our school building has the space to accommodate smaller class sizes. UFT, CSA, and the DOE have come up with an agreement to get funding to schools that can make this happen now.

40% of classes are in compliance citywide this school year.

WHAT'S THE PLAN TO GET TO 60% NEXT YEAR?

All schools with the space but needing funds to lower class sizes can apply for money for next school year.

By 2028

Schools throughout the city must reach 100% compliance.



Class size funding application

This year, schools can apply to receive ADDITIONAL funding for **next school year** to reduce class sizes. Principals and chapter leaders were notified **in late October** with a training session and a link to apply.

We pushed the DOE to create this application process to avoid having the city mess up on using the state funds again.

Administration Update from Principal Xerri

- There have been teenagers not always behaving appropriately in the park.
- Attended a community youth meeting to discuss a couple issues that affect Mathew Sapolin Park. The police officer said they will be more active there after school. They plan to do positive outreach to prevent teenagers from smoking, gambling in the park. As a parent if you ever have concerns, you can

always let me know, or call 311. It is a public park and these are kids. Because it's a public space, authorities have more jurisdiction and ability to speak to individuals doing anything illicit.

- Happy Thanksgiving, I'm thankful for everyone, for our kids, for our teachers. Have a great weekend.
- Q: Where will funds go (\$25,000 from the Assemblymember)?
 - A: Not sure what the restrictions are yet. School wide programs must always have a licensed teacher.
- Q: Is there an update on the Art Teacher?
 - A: Happy to say we have hired a candidate as an art teacher. Onboarding with the DOE is a 2.5 week process, we're very excited. Once she starts I'll let her introduce herself to you through a letter. We're 99 percent there. We take hiring very seriously here in our school, there is an extensive process with lots of demo lessons and we want to make sure whoever works here will stay with us forever. That's always our goal.

Parent Coordinator Update from Sara Lise Raff

- Current savings account earns 0.05% APR
- Proposing to move \$200,000 out of savings account to a 6-month CD account with a 4.5% APR (quoted as of last week)
- Both accounts are with our current bank - TD Bank

Finance Update through 10/31/2024

Income

- **Family Giving** received \$30,322 through 10/31
 - Only at 23% of **Goal of \$130,000**
 - *Breakdown by grade on next slide*
- **Corporate Match** \$9,559 (38% of **Goal of \$25,000**)
- **School Store** Revenue \$6,562
- October Events:
 - **Fall Festival** Net Revenue \$9,200 (**42% higher than goal!**)
 - Total Revenue \$11,244 less Expenses \$2,724
 - Received \$500 sponsorship from JCC
 - **5th Grade Fundraising** (Pie sale) \$2,931. Activity picked up in November.

Finance Update through 10/31/2024

Expenses

- **PTA Funded Enrichment Programs** donation made in July: \$260,705
- PTA Donations to Support to Pay for School Expenses: \$35,769
 - Includes classroom materials, office equipment, printer, toner, teacher class materials (aka startup fund with \$200 allowance per teacher)
 - 5th Grade PTA Contribution: \$3,479 (this year sweatshirts + \$606 related to last year)
- PTA Operating Expenses: \$7,847
 - Fundraising Events: \$2,724 (Fall Festival Expenses)
 - Non-Fundraising Events: \$5,123
 - Includes Hospitality & Community events, Teacher Appreciation, PTA Technology (Konstella, Website, other tech platforms)
